1. The Ministry of Explained (2 Corinthians 1-7)

A. The Suffering of the Ministry (1:1-2:13)

1. Paul suffered because his enemies persecuted him (1:3-11)

2. Paul suffered because his converts misunderstood him (1:12-2:11)

3. Paul suffered because his co-workers miscommunicated with him

(2:12-13)

A) Paul saw an Open Door at Ephesus (1 Corinthians 16:5-9)

B) Paul sees an Open Door at Troas (2 Corinthians 2:12-13) Paul starts a church (Acts 20:1-7)

- 1) Paul was troubled but he looked for opportunities (Colossians 4:2-4).
- 2) Paul was troubled but focused on the positive.

(2 Corinthians 2:14-7:4 has been called “The Great Digression” where Paul focuses on the Glory of the Ministry instead of the Suffering of the Ministry)

- a) *The Ministry is Victorious (2:14-17)*
- b) *The Ministry is Transforming (3:1-18)*
- c) *The Ministry is Powerful (4:1-18)*
- d) *The Ministry is Motivated (5:1-21)*
- e) *The Ministry is Separated (6:1-7:1)*
- f) *The Ministry is Comforting (7:2-16)*

B. The Glory of the Ministry (2 Corinthians 2:14-7:16)

1. The Ministry is Victorious (2:14-17)

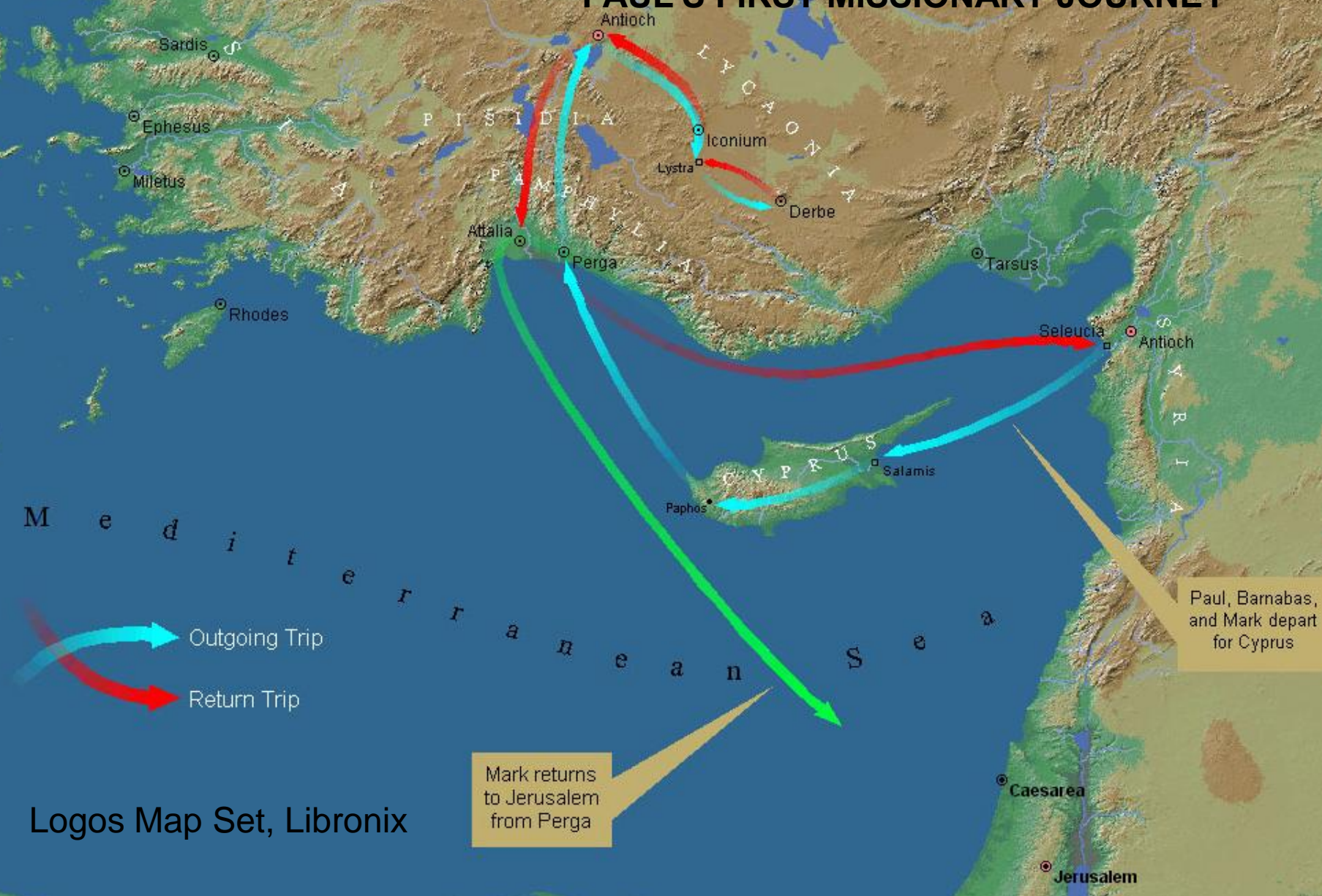
A) We can express thanks for God’s leading (2:14)

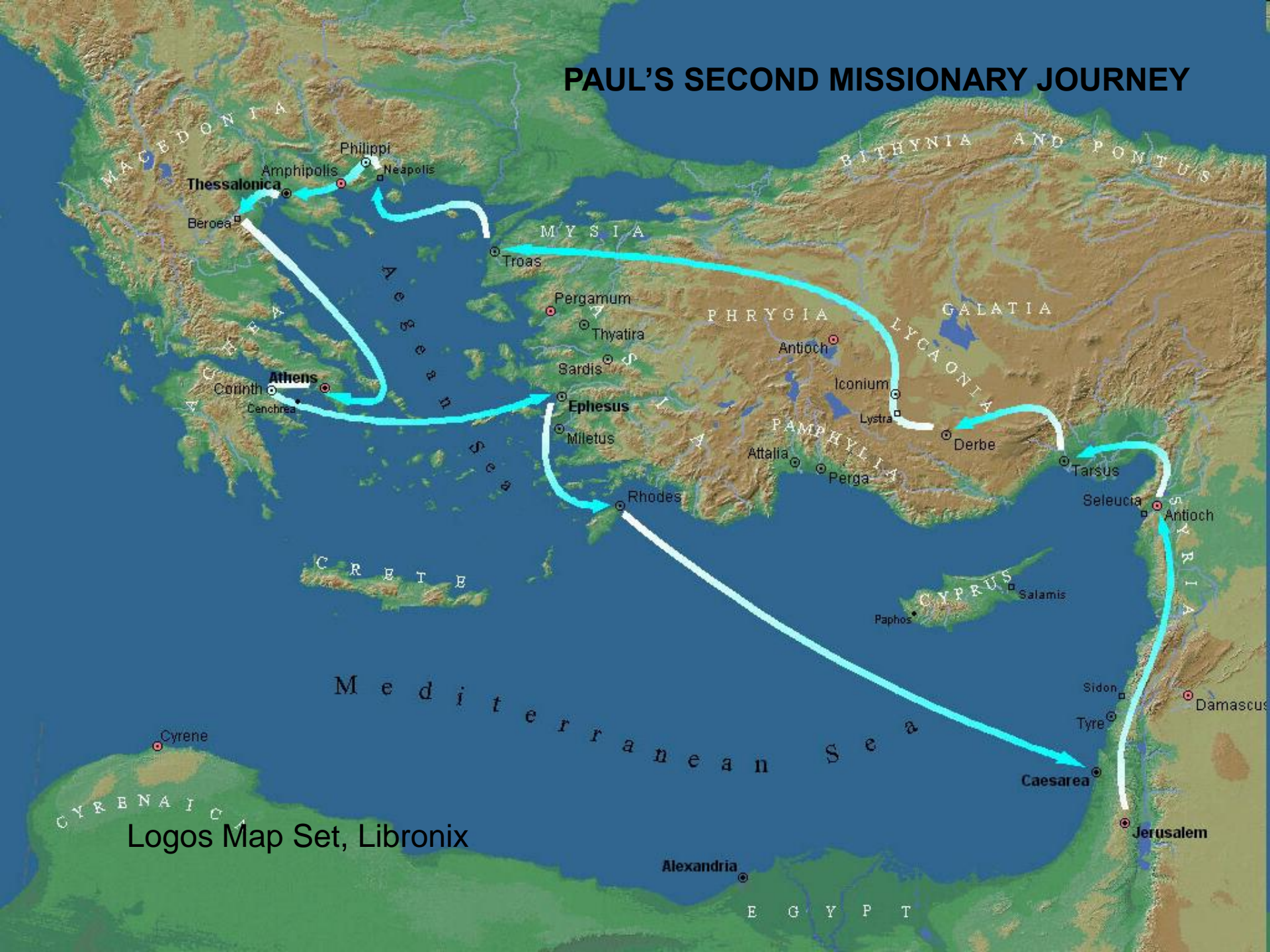
