

Rededication to the Lord

(The Book of Deuteronomy)

Sunday evening February 27

1. God's Word was written to be preached to persuade listeners to be "doers of the Word and not hearers only."
2. Moses wrote Deuteronomy at the age 120 on the plains of Moab about two months before his death (Deuteronomy 1:2 and Joshua 5:10).
3. Deuteronomy is three sermons preached by Moses to persuade God's people to renew their commitment.

First Sermon "Rededicate Because of God's Past Blessings" (Chapter 1-4)

Second Sermon "Rededicate Because of God's Present Commands" (Chapter 5-26)

Third Sermon "Rededicate Because of God's Future Blessings or Chastenings" (Chapters 27-30)

First Sermon "Rededicate Because of God's Past Blessings" Chapters 1-4

A. Review and Remember God's Past Blessings (1:1-3:29)

1. God's people delivered from bondage of slavery at Mount Sinai (1:5-18)
2. God's people rebelled at Kadesh-barnea (1:19-46)
3. God's people needs supplied in the Wilderness wanderings (2:1-25)
4. God's people given victory over enemies in Transjordan (2:26-3:29)

B. Call to Rededication (4:1-43)

Second Sermon "Rededicate Because of God's Present Commands" Chapter 5-26

A. Remember the Moral Law (10 Commandments) (Chapters 5-11)

1. The Ten Commandments must be obeyed (5:1-21)
2. The Great Commandments must be taught (6:1-9)
 - a. Beware of prosperity (6:10-19)
 - b. Destroy sin or be destroyed (7:1-26)
 - c. Remember the Lord's testings (8:1-6)
 - d. Beware of prosperity (8:7-20)
 - e. Beware of self-righteousness (9:1-29)
 - f. Ten Commandments (10:1-11)
 - g. The Great Commandment (10:12-11:20)
