

Rededication to the Lord

(The Book of Deuteronomy)

Sunday evening March 6th

1. God's Word was written to be preached to persuade listeners to be "doers of the Word and not hearers only."
2. Moses wrote Deuteronomy at the age 120 on the plains of Moab about two months before his death (Deuteronomy 1:2 and Joshua 5:10).
3. Deuteronomy is three sermons preached by Moses to persuade God's people to renew their commitment.

First Sermon "Rededicate Because of God's Past Blessings" Chs 1-4

Second Sermon "Rededicate Because of God's Present Commands" Chs 5-26

Third Sermon "Rededicate Because of Future Blessings or Chastenings" Chs 27-30

A. Curses pronounced (27:1-26)

B. Blessings pronounced and preached (28:1-14)

C. Curses pronounced and preached (28:20-68)

- 1. Obedience will bring blessing (29:1-15)**
- 2. Disobedience of one person will bring curses (29:16-29)**
 - a. Obedience brings restoration of God's blessings (30:1-10)**
 - b. Therefore choose life/blessing (30:11-20)**

D. God's blessings continued through a successor (31:1-8)

E. God's blessings continued through the Word (31:9-29)

F. God's blessings continued through song (31:30-32:43)

G. God's blessings continued through the death of His servant (32:44-52)

- 1. Moses prepares for death (32:44-52)**
- 2. Moses blesses his people before his death (33:1-29)**
- 3. Moses is both cursed and blessed by God in his death (34)**
